JOIN BAD HABIT PRODUCTIONS FOR AN ALL IN THE TIMING TRAVELING SHOW CIRCUS

(Boston, MA) – Following its critically acclaimed production of *The Laramie Project*, Bad Habit Productions (BHP) is proud to announce the third and final installment of its 2008-2009 season: David Ives's *All in the Timing*, directed by BHP Artistic Director, Daniel Morris and Anna Waldron. The traveling production runs from April 3rd to April 19th at Hennessey's in Boston (April 3rd, 10th, and 17th); Somerville Theater in Somerville (April 4th, 11th, and 18th); The Burren in Somerville (April 5th and 19th); and Sweet Water Café in Boston (April 5th and 19th).

For this event, BHP is breaking out of the black box to bring this hilarious night of one-act plays to three Boston-area bars and a movie theatre. David Ives' *All in the Timing* is a collection of six short comedies, spinning absurd tales of love, language, missed opportunities, music, Marxism and monkeys.

The fun, casual, community settings for the production bring Ives' raucously clever script to vibrant life. Whether laughing at frustrated, literary-challenged monkeys in *Words, Words, Words*, or learning a new, artificial alphabet in *The Universal Language*, or singing along to the wacky *Phillip Glass Buys a Loaf of Bread*, audiences are sure to delight in these light-hearted, but nonetheless thought-provoking, short comedies.

When asked what attracted her to Ives' and his highly entertaining plays, co-director Anna Waldron stated:

"Ives' pieces are very dense and witty, and yet they are also fast-paced, light and funny. It's a rare talent that can combine such brilliant literary references with slapstick. I love how Ives will take an idea or a cliché and run with it, taking it to the next level and pushing it to its ultimate conclusion. The results are packed with humor and brains."
